Season of Creation September 1st -October 4th 2024 SEEDS OF HOPE



Creation is groaning (Romans 8:22)

The times we live in show that we are not relating to the Earth as a gift from our Creator, but rather as a resource to be used. Saint Francis of Assisi understood this when he referred to the Earth as our sister and our mother in his Canticle of Creatures. How can Mother Earth look after us if we do not look after her? Creation is groaning because of the unsustainable actions that harm her. And yet, there is hope and the expectation for a better future. To hope in a biblical context does not mean to stand still and quiet, but rather actively strive for new life amidst the struggles.

This year's symbol: First fruits of hope (Rom 8:23-25) Hope is given to us by God as a protection and guard against futility. Only through hope we may realise the gift of freedom in fullness. Freedom and responsibility enable us to make the world a better place. Only when we work together with Creation can the first fruits of hope emerge.

Bernadette Soubirous was born in Lourdes, a small town in the foothills of the Pyrenees Mountains in the year 1844. She was born into a poor but loving family, who suffered many hardships. This simple peasant girl was chosen to give the message of the love God has for all mankind "as the adopted children of His Blessed Mother."

In 1858, she saw the Virgin Mary eighteen times at the Grotto of Massabielle: the Apparitions of Lourdes were authenticated in 1866 by the Bishop of Tarbes. In that same year, Bernadette left Lourdes to live out her religious vocation within the community of the Sisters of Charity of Nevers. She entered the convent of the Sisters of Charity, where she carried out humble work and was not given any special treatment. In silence, she endured extreme pain as she became seriously ill with tuberculosis of the lungs and bones. This humble saint died at the age of thirty-five and was proclaimed blessed in 1925, then a saint in 1933.
